

## **The Renaissance Performance Sport Trifecta 2026**

### **Do you have a Renaissance Dog?**

All handlers are invited to participate in the Renaissance Performance Sport Trifecta, a special titling event offered jointly by All Dogs Parkour (ADP), Cyber Rally-O (CRO), and Poised for Success Freestyle (PFS). This event was created in 2024 to honor the Summer Olympics.

### **Who Can Play?**

It is the policy of ADP, CRO, and PFSF to exclude no one. Dogs with disabilities are welcome and many already have titled in one or more of these venues. While these three Trifecta sports are generally considered dog sports, and "dogs" are referenced throughout this document, other animals are also welcome to join the fun. To date, we have one Renaissance Cat!

### **Dates for Entries**

The event is open for entries from June 15, 2026 through September 15, 2026. Titles earned for the event must be from entries submitted during these dates. Entries may be judged after September 15, and those entries that qualify will count towards the participant's 2026 Trifecta titles. Non-qualifying entries (NQ) may be resubmitted with a retry fee within 14 days of the NQ notification email and, if qualifying, will count towards the participant's 2026 Trifecta titles.

## Registration Numbers

Dogs must be registered with each venue in order to participate. During the event, each venue offers free registration when accompanied by an entry. Entries are \$20 for ADP and CRO and \$15 for PFS. ADP and CRO offer multiple entry discounts.

## How to Enter

There is no separate entry for the Renaissance Performance Sport Trifecta. When you earn any title in All Dogs Parkour, Cyber Rally-O, or Poised for Success Freestyle while the event is open, that title is logged and counted toward the 2026 Trifecta event. You will receive a “Congratulations” email when you earn any Trifecta title.

## RDT Title Requirements

To earn the Renaissance Dog Trifecta (RDT) title, participating teams must

- Earn one new title in All Dogs Parkour.
- Earn one new title in Cyber Rally-O.
- Earn one new title in Poised for Success Freestyle.

Title entries must be submitted during the event dates (June 15, 2026 through September 15, 2026). If you have already earned legs toward a title, and finish that title with entries submitted within the event dates, that title counts toward your Renaissance Dog Trifecta Titles.

In addition to the RDT title, there are various other Trifecta titles available to those who have earned the RDT title. **An illustrated overview of the Trifecta titles is on the next page. Also see Table 1 on page 6.**

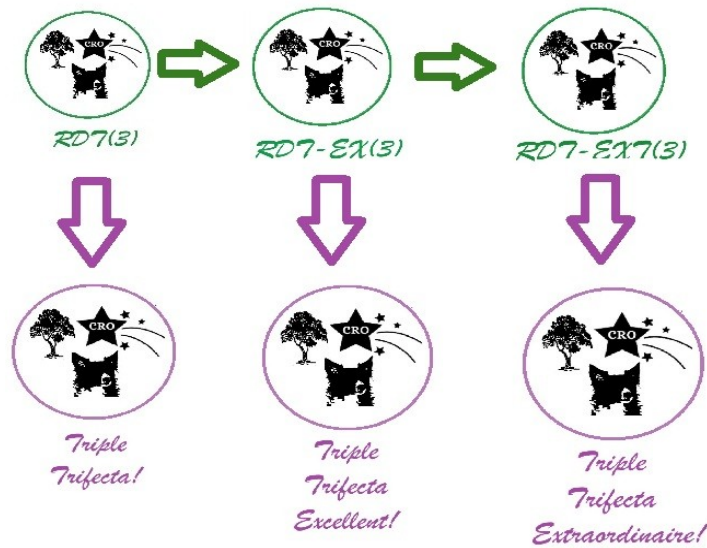

## Where to Start

**NEW to the Trifecta?** If you are new to the Trifecta, you must begin with the RDT title (one new title in ADP, one new title in CRO, one new title in PFS). Skip to page 9 and read **Beginner, Single-Q Titles in ADP, CRO, and PFS**.

**RETURNING to the Trifecta?** If your team earned the RDT or RDT-EX title in a previous year, you may begin submitting entries toward the RDT-EX or RDT-EXT title, respectively. **This is optional.** You may instead begin this year's event by earning another RDT title in order to collect the 2026 RDT ribbon. If you are going for a higher level Trifecta title, see **Upper Level and Second Trifecta Titles** (page 4) and **Triple Trifecta Titles** (page 5). If you are opting for another RDT title, skip to page 9 and review the single-entry titles for each venue.

**MULTIPLE DOGS at your home?** See the **Two-Dog Team Option for Handlers with Multiple Dogs** section on page 7.

### Upper Level and Second Trifecta Titles

**Upper Level Trifecta Titles:** For teams wanting more Renaissance Dog Trifecta, two upper level RDT titles are available in the following order

RDT-Excellent (RDT-EX) and  
RDT-Extraordinaire (RDT-EXT).

Similar to the RDT title, each of these upper level RDT titles requires three additional new titles - one in ADP, one in CRO, and one in PFS. Entries must be submitted during the event dates (June 15, 2026 through September 15, 2026).

**Second Trifecta Titles:** Teams completing the requirements for the RDT, RDT-EX, and RDT-EXT for a second time (in the same or different years) earn the RDT(2), RDT-EX(2), and RDT-EXT(2) title, respectively. This title designation is indicated on the title certificate.

## **Triple Trifecta Titles**

New for 2026 are the Triple Trifecta titles at each level (RDT, RDT-EX, and RDT-EXT). To earn a Triple Trifecta title, the team must earn a Trifecta title three times. A team that earns a level title a third time will earn the level title with a (3) designation (example: RDT(3)) and the Triple Trifecta title for that level (example: Triple Trifecta).

Trifecta titles at all levels earned in previous years are applied to this year's Triple titles. So, if your team previously earned RDT(2), RDT-EX(2), or RDT-EXT(2), you need to earn RDT, RDT-EX, or RDT-EXT one more time in order to earn the Triple Trifecta, Triple Trifecta Excellent, or Triple Trifecta Extraordinaire, respectively. If your team previously earned RDT, RDT-EX, or RDT-EXT, you need to earn the RDT, RDT-EX, or RDT-EXT title two more times in order to earn the RDT(3) and Triple Trifecta, RDT-EX(2) and Trifecta Excellent, or RDT-EXT(3) and Triple Trifecta Extraordinaire, respectively.

## Trifecta Titles: Requirements and Prerequisites

**Table 1** lists all available Trifecta titles with the requirements and prerequisites for each. **NOTE: titles are earned sequentially in the order listed in Table 1. (Also see the illustrated overview of the Trifecta titles on page 3.)**

**Table 1. Trifecta Titles, Requirements, and Prerequisites**

<b>Title</b>	<b>Requirement</b>	<b>Prerequisite</b>
RDT	1 new title in each of ADP, CRO, and PFS	Registration*
RDT-EX	1 new title in each of ADP, CRO, and PFS	RDT
RDT-EXT	1 new title in each of ADP, CRO, and PFS	RDT-EX
RDT(2)	Earn the RDT title a second time	RDT
RDT-EX(2)	Earn the RDT-EX title a second time	RDT-EX
RDT-EXT(2)	Earn the RDT-EXT title a second time	RDT-EXT
RDT(3) and Triple Trifecta	Earn the RDT title a third time	RDT(2)
RDT-EX(3) and Triple Trifecta Excellent	Earn the RDT-EX title a third time	RDT-EX(2)
RDT-EXT(3) and Triple Trifecta Extraordinaire	Earn the RDT-EXT title a third time	RDT-EXT(2)

## Two-Dog Team Option for Handlers with Multiple Dogs

Handlers living with multiple dogs may declare two dogs who have earned the RDT title as a Two-Dog Team and then combine entries from the two dogs for subsequent titles. For the Two-Dog Team option, both dogs must live with the handler.

For example, a handler lives with two dogs, Jack and Jill, each of whom has earned an RDT title. The handler may declare Jack and Jill as a Two-Dog Team and then may submit an entry with Jack to earn, for example, the required ADP title, and submit entries with Jill to earn, for example, the required CRO and PFS titles. Then, their RDT Excellent title is awarded to the RDT Team of "Handler and Jack and Jill".

For the Two-Dog Team option the handler may enter any combination(s) of entries from any two of their dogs as long as each dog on an RDT-Excellent Two-Dog Team holds an RDT title, and each dog on an RDT-Extraordinaire Two-Dog Team holds an RDT-Excellent title.

The Two-Dog Team option may be applied for any Trifecta title **except for a dog's first RDT. All dogs must earn their first RDT title individually.**

For a dog's second RDT, the RDT(2), the Two-Dog Team option may be applied if each dog on the team has an RDT-EXT (earned individually or as part of a Two-Dog Team). For a dog's third RDT (and Triple Trifecta), the Two-Dog Team option may be applied if each dog on the team has an RDT-EXT(2) (earned individually or as part of a Two-Dog Team).

**Table 2** lists the Two-Dog Team Trifecta titles, eligibility status, and prerequisites for each dog on the team. For the Two-Dog Team option, both dogs must live with the handler. Two-Dog Team title certificates will show the title preceded by "T-". Ribbon awards are the same for all teams, whether single-dog or two-dog. Trifecta titles that are earned individually and Two-Dog Team titles are equivalent titles.

**Table 2. Trifecta Titles for the Two-Dog Team Option**

<b>Title Awarded</b>	<b>Combine Entries from 2 Dogs if each Dog has</b>
T-RDT	Not available. First RDT must be earned individually
T-RDT-EX	Allowed if each dog has RDT
T-RDT-EXT	Allowed if each dog has RDT-EX
T-RDT(2)	Allowed if each dog has RDT-EXT
T-RDT-EX(2)	Allowed if each dog has RDT(2)
T-RDT-EXT(2)	Allowed if each dog has RDT-EX(2)
T-RDT(3) and Team Triple Trifecta	Allowed if each dog has RDT-EXT(2)
T-RDT-EX(3) and Team Triple Trifecta Excellent	Allowed if each dog has RDT(3)
T-RDT-EXT(3) and Team Triple Trifecta Extraordinaire	Allowed if each dog has RDT-EX(3)

**NOTE:** Special situations may exist where a dog needs to be part of a Two-Dog Team, but the only available teammates are already titled at the next higher level. In these situations, the Two-Dog Team option may still be applied, but the higher-titled teammate will simply re-

earn the title as part of the Two-Dog Team, and will not receive a (2) or (3) designation for the title.

For example, Jill needs a teammate for her RDT-EXT, but the only available teammate is Jack, who already has RDT-EXT. Handler may enter Jack and Jill as a two-dog RDT-EXT team, and the team would earn T-RDT-EXT.

## **Beginner, Single-Q Titles in ADP, CRO, and PFS**

Each venue has beginner titling opportunities that only require a single Q for the title. All teams are eligible for beginner, single Q titles.

The beginner titles are designed to be done at home in small spaces. They are easily attainable by teams with little or no experience in these sports. Your dog likely already knows many of the behaviors needed for one of the beginner titles in each venue.

**All Dogs Parkour** offers three levels of Foundation Skills titles, each requiring only a single Q for the title. They may be done in any order. Additionally, only one Q is required for a title at each of the 5 levels in each of the Creative Challenges: Dozen, Ingenuity, Ladders, Opposites, Theme, and Theme Supreme. New teams must start with Level 1 for these titles.

The Core Regular Track and Core Grand Champion Track Level 1 and Level 2 titles only require a single entry for a title. New teams must start with Level 1, Regular Track.

In addition, in the new Anywhere Tracks, Regular Track and Grand Champion Track Level 1 and Level 2 also require only a single entry for a title. Teams may earn both Core and Anywhere titles.

**Cyber Rally-O** offers four levels of Foundation Rally Skills titles, each requiring only a single Q for the title. FRS titles may be earned in any order. CRO Games Division currently offers five games, each with five levels and two tracks. Each level on each track is a single Q title, level 5 is also a Championship title. In Games Division, titles must be earned in order of levels 1-5. CRO Rally Division has five levels and two tracks. Rally titles each require three Qs, but for teams holding an equivalent first level rally title in another venue (such as AKC Novice or WCRL Level 1), only one Q is required to earn the CRO Level I title.

**Poised for Success Freestyle** offers a set of Etude titles, each requiring only a single Q for the title. The following five Etudes will be offered throughout the duration of the Trifecta: Bunny Hop, Daffodil Stomp, Festival of Props, Rose Cotillion and Transition Tango. Etudes have one, two, or three levels, for more information see each Etude's guidelines. The other beginner titles (Debut Division and Overture) require more Qs for each title, but both titles are easily attainable by new dogs (Debut) and dogs with basic obedience and/or trick skills (Overture). Debut Division is a training level foundation title, similar to the Foundation titles in ADP and CRO.

Videos of qualifying entries for all single-title options begin on page 13 under "Sample Entries". For help deciding which titles might best suit your team, ask for help in the appropriate FB group listed on pages 12 - 13.

## Title Awards

Teams (whether a handler and dog team, or handler and Two-Dog Team) earning a Trifecta title will receive a hard copy title certificate and the corresponding ribbon(s) or rosette listed in Table 3 below. Titles listed below include those earned by Two-Dog teams (“T-”).

## Video Entries

All entries are by video. If you are not familiar with video entries, it's easy to learn. Experienced handlers in the ADP, CRO, and PFSF groups are all happy to help you get started. Video entries ROCK because they fully capture the memories of your accomplishments with your dog.

## **Equipment**

Some titles require one or more props which may be a readily available household item (e.g., mat, dog bed, chair, table, book, etc.) or common training prop (platform, pivot pot, cone, etc.). You will not need any specialized props to participate.

For All Dogs Parkour, a back clip harness and leash is required if working with environmental features above the dog's elbow height.
